Four-year study in Ireland with reduced fee is an option for many in the Philadelphia Area

PHILADELPHIA (15 October 2021) – The Irish Diaspora Center (IDC), through the work of the Irish Diaspora Education Alliance (IDEA) committee, has secured opportunities for five students from the Philadelphia area to attend a four-year degree program at Ireland's university of enterprise, Dublin City University (DCU). The cost of a four-year program in Ireland varies depending on the University; however, there are options that make study abroad a comparable option to State and Private Universities in the United States.

Before COVID began, a group of interested parents and educators formed the IDEA committee through the IDC. The goal was to develop partnerships with Irish Universities and seek recognition for local Philadelphia students who are Irish citizens (by birth or through a parent or grandparent) the option of earning a bachelor's degree from an accredited University in Ireland. "This program will provide a pathway to enhance educational /academic experience and intercultural understanding that studying with an international University can provide to the involved students" stated John McDaid, Chair of the IDEA committee and IDC Board member.

Five students, selected by the DCU admissions team, will obtain between 15-20% reduction on tuition for the duration of their program depending on their GPA.

Eligible students can benefit from this award beginning the school year 2022/23 with the following criteria:

1. Applicants must hold a current Irish Passport
2. Applicants must be referred by the IDEA (Philadelphia). In order to ensure that this is noted with your application, please include a personal statement including the fact that you are applying as an IDEA supported student and add this with the [DCU application form](#).
3. Applicants must provide completed High School transcripts by June 30, 2022

Candidates will be screened for eligibility for admission by DCU who shall have final authority on admission decisions. General eligibility criteria set by DCU is a minimum 3.2 GPA on a 4.0 GPA scale. Certain programs have mandatory prerequisite subjects for entry consideration.

The award will only apply for the first attempt of each academic year. Should a student have to resit exams or retake any element of the program that is fee bearing, the non-EU fee will apply without a fee reduction.
