


















Structure of UG Programmesat University of Galway



Federal Aid

Eligible students at University of Galway can apply for the following Federal Aid loans:

- Direct Loans (which can be Subsidized or Unsubsidized)
- Direct PLUS loans (which can be Parent PLUS or Graduate PLUS)
- Private Loans also available via Sallie Mae (bank)



Working as a US Student in Ireland



- To subsidise your studies, students may engage in casual employment.
- Casual employment is defined as up to 20 hours part - time work per week, except for two standardized periods when it is permissible to work full - time (i.e. up to 40 hours per week).
- The periods are December 15 to January 15 and June 1 to September 30 only, corresponding to the traditional summer and winter college holidays. These dates are fixed for all non -EEA students, regardless of the actual college teaching calendar for their course.

- Employment in Galway after you finish your studies is a real possibility. Galway is one of the world's leading global med-tech hubs with many multinationals based in the city.
- 1 2 year stay back visa scheme which will allow you to remain in Ireland for employment.

Some courses offer an industry placement, while other courses enable students to take on the role of consultants and work directly with an assigned real live company to address a specific problem and develop a research-based solution.
